

Notes on 2 Sets of Manuals

This is not a new requirement. It is only recently being enforced.

The manufacturer of the **E.P.S.S** (**E**mergency **P**ower **S**upply **S**ystem) was required to supply two sets manuals when the equipment was new. So, if your system is fairly new, ask for them. They should be provided at no cost to you.

If your system is older, you will probably have to pay for the manuals. The generator manufacturer should be able to provide them.

You will need to consider all major components.

1. A detailed explanation of the operation of the system. (I know of no manufacturer that provides this. Ask anyway)
2. Instructions for routine maintenance
3. Detailed instructions for repair of the entire system including the automatic transfer switch. (Another problem. Often the generator and transfer switch are built by two different manufacturers. Good luck getting the instructions)
4. Illustrated parts list and part numbers.
5. Illustrated and schematic drawings of electrical wiring systems, including operating and safety devices, control panels, instrumentation, and annunciators.
